## Moses in Egypt

### 2: 1-15



From Adam to **Christ**, there is none greater than **Moses**. **He** is one of the few characters of Scripture whose life is recorded from birth to death. **He** is one of the most commanding figures of the ancient world. In **his** character, in **his** faith, in **his** achievements, and in the unique position assigned to **him** as the mediator between **YHVH** and **His** people, **Moses** stands first among the heroes of the Hebrew Scriptures. All of **God's** early dealings with **Isra'el** were transacted through **Moshe**. **He** was a prophet, priest and king in one person.<sup>15</sup> **He** lived in **Egypt** for forty years, and what **he** learned was that **he** was not an **Egyptian**, but a member of **the tribe of Levi, a Hebrew**.
