The Significance of Dani'el Chapter 2 to the Times of the Gentiles



Luke describes this period of **time** when **he** wrote: They will fall by the sword and will be taken as prisoners to all the nations. Jerusalem will be trampled on by the Gentiles until the times of the Gentiles are fulfilled (to see link click Ao - The Times of the Gentiles). This can best be defined as that long period of **time** from the Babylonian Captivity (see the commentary on **Jeremiah** Gu - Seventy Years of Imperial Babylonian Rule) to the Second Coming of Messiah, during which **time the Gentiles** have complete dominance over **Jerusalem**. This does not rule out temporary **Jewish** control of **the City** until the Second Coming. Such temporary control was exercised during the Maccabbean Period (164-163 BC), the First Jewish Revolt against Rome in 66 AD, and the Second Jewish Revolt (the Bar Cochba Revolt) against Rome (132-135 AD), and since 1967 as a result of the Six Day War. This, too, was temporary, since Gentiles will trample down the holy City for at least another 1,260 days (see the commentary on Revelation Bx - The Tribulation Temple). Therefore, any **Jewish** takeover of **the City** of **Jerusalem** before the Second Coming must be viewed as temporary and does not mean that the Times of the Gentiles have ended. The Times of the Gentiles can only end when the Gentiles no longer trample down the City of **Ierusalem**. 114
