The Priority of Love Over Spiritual Gifts 12:31b to 13:13



It was Jonathan Swift, the satirical author of Gulliver's Travels, who said, "We have just enough religion to make us hate, but not enough to make us **love** one another." Spiritual gifts, no matter how exciting and wonderful, are useless and even destructive if they are not ministered in **love**. The Corinthian believers were not displaying love toward one another. Quite the contrary. They were busily trying to outdo each other by elevating some **spiritual gifts** above others, and some positions of power above others, by seeking places on the platform to the exclusion of others. No wonder Paul chided them a bit when he suggested that when an unbeliever visited **their** church won't he say you're crazy (14:23)? Therefore, Paul pointed a finger in their faces and essentially told them that without love it didn't matter what spiritual gifts the Ruach Ha'Kodesh distributed in their church. They meant nothing without love.
