Then Abraham Returned to Beersheba 22: 19



After **their** mountaintop experience, **Abraham** and **Isaac** returned to the **servants**, as **he** had promised. What a contrast between the journey to Mount Moriah and the return home again! **Abraham** had proved that **ADONAI** was faithful, and having accepted and fulfilled **the LORD's** will, **he** was filled with peace and unspeakable joy.³⁶⁹ **They all set off together for Beersheba. And Avraham stayed in Beersheba (22:19).** After an extended time there, **he** and **Sarah** returned to **the great trees of Mamre** near **Hebron** to live out **their** days (**14:13, 18:1**).

There is no doubt that **Avraham** and **Isaac** came down the mountain, were reunited with the two **servants** and went home again. **But it is interesting that Isaac is not mentioned here. This verse reads: Abraham returned to his servants. Where is Isaac? Because Isaac is a type of Christ, He is in heaven and absent from the earth. But here in Genesis, the name of Isaac is absent from the time that he is offered on Mount Moriah until he is united with his bride at the Well of the Living Water in 24:62.**
